As professionals come together to share their expertise and the collective experiences, knowledge gained at the meeting will have a direct impact on the quality enhancing of care delivered to patients.



GUILDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSIONS

- Submit your abstract by email to SHARP@dundee.ac.uk.
- Abstracts should be no more than 250 words (excluding title, figures, tables, and references).
- You may submit more than one abstract, providing all work is distinct from each other.
- You MUST submit your abstract on the template provided which can be downloaded via the link below.


SHARP PRIZE 2024 – ABSTRACT TEMPLATE

- All abstracts should be MS Word format.
- Please save your abstract using this format: "SHARP2024-(yourLastName)"
- The deadline for abstract submissions is 30th September 2024 at 23:59 (UK time)
- If you want to withdraw an abstract, please contact SHARP@dundee.ac.uk by the submission deadline.





TERMS & CONDITIONS



ABSTRACT SUBMISSION TERMS & CONDITIONS

- All correspondence relating to the abstract will be sent to the corresponding author only.
- You must confirm that you have permission from all authors to submit your Abstract.
- In submitting an abstract you confirm that you, or the presenting author, will attend the conference.
- Any changes to the presenter or any other contact details must be communicated directly to SHARP (SHARP@dundee.ac.uk).
- Authors can edit their abstract up until the submission deadline, no further changes will be accepted after this date.







SELECTION & PREPARATION

HOW ARE ABSTRACTS SELECTED?

Abstracts are reviewed and shortlisted by the SHARP organising committee who will assess whether the proposed paper fits the scope of the conference.

REGISTRATION FOR THE CONFERENCE

When submissions are accepted, all participants must confirm their involvement by email and by registering for the conference. The link to register will be sent to you in your acceptance email. The presenting author will receive complimentary day registration for both days of the conference.

POSTER PRESENTERS

- You must supply a printed poster for display at the conference.
- Posters must be size A0 and portrait orientation. We cannot display posters larger than A0.
- Please bring your poster with you on the day for display.
- Please submit a PowerPoint version of your poster to SHARP@dundee.ac.uk by 7th November 2024at 23:59 (UK Time).

ORAL PRESENTERS

- In addition to the poster requirements, please submit a copy of your PowerPoint presentation to SHARP@dundee.ac.uk by 14th November 2024 at 23:59 (UK Time).
- Please bring a copy of your presentation with you on a USB as a back-up.
- You will have the opportunity to meet with the technician prior to your session.



POSTER GUIDELINES

1. General Format:

• Size & Orientation: A0 size and in portrait orientation. We cannot display posters larger than A0.

2. Content:

- Title: Include a concise and descriptive title at the top. Use a large, bold font (at least 72 pt).
- Organise content into distinct sections: Introduction, Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusion.
- Use clear headings (24-36 pt) to define each section.

3. Visuals:

- Images and Graphs: Use high-quality images and ensure they are clearly labelled. Graphics should be easy to read from a distance.
- Colour Scheme: Use a professional colour scheme that enhances readability. Avoid overly bright or clashing colours.
- Fonts: Use sans-serif fonts for readability (e.g., Arial, Helvetica). Keep font sizes consistent; typically, body text should be 24-36 pt.





POSTER GUIDELINES

4. Layout:

- Flow: Arrange content in a logical flow that guides viewers from the title to the conclusions.
- Sections: Use clear headings and subheadings to separate sections.
- White Space: Include white space as appropriate to avoid clutter and make the poster easier to read.

5. Presentation:

- Practice: Be prepared to present your poster and discuss your research with attendees. Practice a brief summary (1-2 minutes) of your work.
- Engagement: Encourage questions and discussions from viewers. Be open to feedback.

6. Submission and On-Site Instructions

- Printing: You are required to supply a printed poster for display at the conference.
- Arrive early to set up your poster and use the provided display materials for affixing your poster.
- Take your poster down at the end of the conference.
- Deadlines: Please submit a PowerPoint version of your poster to SHARP@dundee.ac.uk by 7th November 2024 at 23:59 (UK Time).
- Please name your file using the format: "SHARP2024-(yourLastName)"
